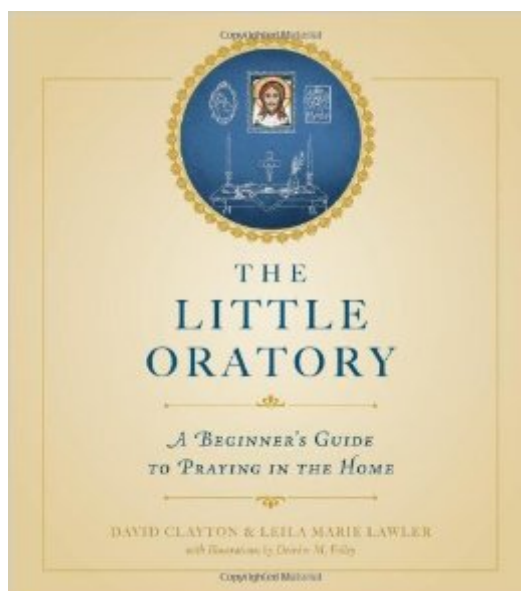

There is not one among us who couldn't stand to pray more and pray better. That is why thousands of books have been written on the subject of prayer. The Little Oratory is one of the latest ones to be released, and it is billed as a beginners guide to prayer in the home. But what exactly is an oratory? If it wasn't for the definition in the first chapter, I would had to have Googled the word to know that it means a sacred space for prayer and private worship. Before telling us how to build this little oratory, the book first expounds on the Christian life and the importance of family life in the home. The authors then give advice on how to order and organize the house, room by room. For example, the master bedroom is meant to be ordered and neat. It is okay to have a crib in it, but all the items for the baby including diapers and toys must be in a certain place, and not strewn about. That's nice in a magazine, but not always practical. I do agree with the authors when they say that the living room or den need not be centered around the television, and I also agree that shelves provide great assistance no matter what room of the house. We then begin the chapter of making and placing the home altar. Included in the chapter on "Making the Little Oratory at Home" is tips for linens, candles, prayerbooks, etc. All of these tips are fine, but I disagree with their section on iconography. The author's equate iconography to just another form of art and put it on equal ground with Western art, like Michaelangelo. Iconography is more than art, and it is not even about creating "beautiful art." Icons are prayer and designed to aid in worship. That is why they have specific rules when being written. They should also never be framed, as suggested by the authors.

I have been hoping for a book like this for such a long time! Not only is it groundbreaking, but every Catholic should read and refer to it often. The authors provide principles and guidance to establish prayer in the home in union with the Church's Liturgy. And as the the authors are both converts, they adroitly sift through the myriad of Catholic devotions to show clearly how to lay the foundation of the family prayer life. Their central focus is on the oratory in the home, which can be an icon corner or prayer table, home altar or dining room table. The book provides guidelines of beauty,

order and simplicity to set up, maintain, and use the oratory regularly for individual and family prayer. After establishing the prayer space, the authors continue with ways to pray with the Universal Church through the Liturgy of the Hours. They also discuss other devotions, such as the liturgical year, rosary, dedication of days and months and more. Each author brings their expertise and their combined thoughts are wonderful. David Clayton shares aspects from the Byzantine or Eastern tradition. As an icon painter, he shares the spirituality and symbolism of icons and how they relate to prayer. The book contains several of his beautiful color icons to frame and use, or line drawings that can be colored. Leila Lawler shares her experience as a wife, mother of seven and grandmother living her Faith with her practical "kitchen sink philosophy." Her daughter, Deirdre Folley, has wonderful line drawings throughout which really relate a peaceful domesticity. This does not need to be read straight through, but each chapter can stand alone.
