

Tony Ortega, in his first book, has hit it out of the ball-park. I devoured the book. It is well paced, well written, deeply researched by a first-class reporter and very moving. It begs to be made into a blockbuster movie. Read it and weep that Scientology has a tax-exemption from the IRS. Read it and rejoice that "The Unbreakable Miss Lovely" is alive and well and that her story is told.

This book ought to be a fictional crime thriller but it's not fiction...the cult of Scientology, under orders from its paranoid leader L. Ron Hubbard, tried to destroy journalist Paulette Cooper because she wrote a book exposing some of their unethical and even criminal practices. The book is beautifully researched and impossible to put down. Even if you don't care about Scientology but are fascinated by crime thrillers, you will stay up all night reading this book. An amazing record of the experiences of an amazing lady.

As a frequent reader of the author's daily blog about the weird, wild world of Scientology (tonyortega.org), I was fully expecting the book to be well researched and chock full of interesting details that could only be unearthed through intrepid reporting and the benefit of four decades of perspective on the events. What I did not expect, and was very pleasantly surprised to get, was a fast paced but factually grounded thriller akin to a Michael Crichton novel. Crichton's skill was

blurring the line between the real and the not quite real in the scientific arena until the reader often forgot which was which. Ortega's skill is documenting the facts while simultaneously assisting the reader to understand the surreal nature of the events, particularly to those who experienced them firsthand. In this case, primarily Ms. Cooper. This was a thoroughly satisfying read that I would recommend without hesitation. Hopefully Mr. Ortega will find a suitable subject for a second book sometime in the future.
