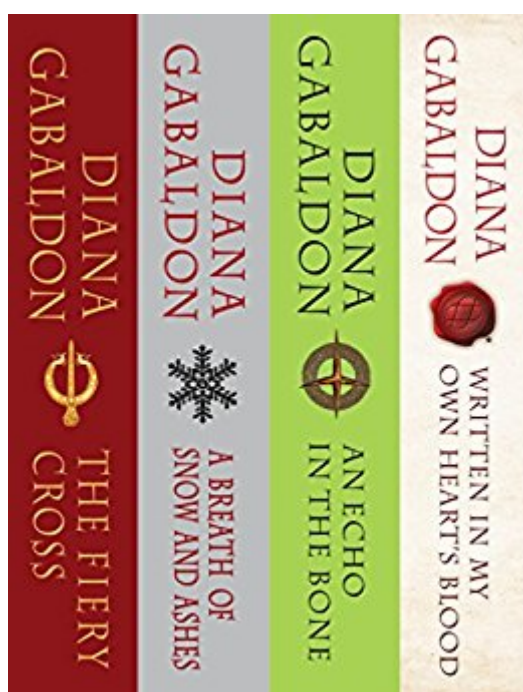

I read all eight of the books, one right after the other, so obviously, I really liked the series. I liked how it was very descriptive of people, places, and events. The author made the characters real and individual. I did enjoy the romantic aspect of the books as well as the historic settings; however, after about the third book I had to skim over some of the sex parts even though I thought they were tastefully done. I just couldn't take that much sex after having fought off bandits, robbers, thieves and rapists with knives, swords and guns while running through the dense woods after having performed numerous surgical/medical procedures and tended an herb garden. I was just too tired for sex!! I recommend this series and I will look for more books by this author.

I binged through the eight books, grateful that they are long and complex and that I can easily read them over and over. I am resigned to wait and to patiently endure Gabaldon's good-natured website ribbings about how we clamor for more and more... because I really am smitten with the Outlander world and enamored of the lovely mind of the author. The thing that hooked me and reeled me in is the way Gabaldon engages sense memory. She is forever telling us how places and people smell. It helps me remember details -- how odd is that? The other thing is that I like Claire so much and I love when she tells me the cheeky things she is thinking. Also Gabaldon has such an interesting view of how the sacred and the profane connect. Her magical world is very plausible -- she knits together the time travel and the ghosts, the fairies and the healing herbs, love and life and death and sex and blood and guts and horrors that must be answered by wise and cunning and brave and bloody protectors -- and the world makes sense. I think she has done a Good thing here.

I've written my main review under the 1st Outlander bundle with Books 1-4. Each book seems to get better as Diana Gabaldon skillfully weaves her characters into real historical events. Whether in the 18th or 20th century, time continues to pass at the same speed for the time traveler who is living in either era. These books continue the adventures of 20th century Claire, her 18th century Scottish husband Jamie Frazer, and their extended family, friends and enemies as they try to make a life in the colony of North Carolina just before and during the American Revolution.

Fascinating. Written in 1st person for the most part, but some from second person. A good historical time travel fantasy, between 18th and 20th centuries. Well defined characters, rich full views of different cultural contexts, especially Scottish Highland culture and Colonial American

I love the story, I love the writing. I have only one regret... buying the bundle for my Kindle. Yes, I saved a bit of money, but the books are so HUGE that it is difficult to find my place (I have multiple devices, and no, they are not synched.) My tablet does not allow me to skip through by chapter, so I have to go by percentage. 1% of each of these books covers a substantial number of pages; 1% of the four books together makes the task much more difficult. (This is also complicated by the fact that I am not reading these for the first time so no matter what page I land on, the story is familiar.)
