

It appears that many of the dining and lodging references are outdated. In some cases, recommended restaurants have been closed for several years. As an example, 2 out of 4 recommended eateries in Traverse City are no longer in business. Perhaps the author hasn't been to the area in a very long time or never really visited the places he recommended. These mistakes distract from an otherwise useful guide.

I'm new to kayaking, and live in Michigan. I was hoping this book would give me some insiders information as to local kayaking. It really did not. Contains good information about Michigan's parks, and kayaking/canooing in general -- but all that is available elsewhere.

On the plus side the author appears to have an amazing familiarity with the streams, lakes, and coastal waters of Michigan. So this short book is a good overview of the paddling possibilities in the state. Because the topic is broad, and the book rather short, there really isn't sufficient information for me to comfortably plan a trip based solely on this resource. Further limiting the usefullness is the lack of maps of the routes discussed--which means you really have to read it with a decent Michigan map by your side.
