

This book is a must-read for baseball fans and anyone interested in the business of sports. In The Game, Jon Pessah offers a riveting account of the modern baseball era under the reigns of Bud Selig, Donald Fehr and George Steinbrenner. Based on 5 years of research and interviews with

more than 150 individuals including players, executives, former members of Congress, and even Bud Selig himself, Pessah recreates a behind-the-scenes view of the meetings, strategies, decisions, and subplots that shaped the game â " and the business of baseball â " as we know it. The book is gripping from the opening scene and reads more like a novel â " or even a movie script â "than a typical non-fiction book. It is a formidable 630 pages which reflects the incredible depth of the research, but there isnâ ™t a dull moment. The book is actually difficult to put down once you start. The author puts the reader in the minds of the real-life characters behind the sport â " it makes you feel like you are witnessing history firsthand. The Game chronicles all of the major events in the sport from 1992 through 2010. But in addition to the story we are familiar with from the sports pages at the time, this book gives us a detailed view of what actually happened behind the scenes. The book covers all of the major business aspects affecting the sport including multiple labor negotiations, TV deals, and tax-payer funded stadiums. It covers the power struggles between the owners and players, and among the owners themselves. It describes the complicated relationship between politics and baseball. And it describes in detail the use of steroids in baseball and the perspectives of each stakeholder who tried to address the issue or decided to look the other way.

Review: The last two decades has seen many events occur in Major League Baseball, both on and off the field. From home run records being broken to players being tested for performance enhancing drugs (PEDs) and from a playerâ ™s strike that wiped out the 1994 World Series to the threat of contracting two teams, the era was defined by a quest for power. Three men were the central characters of this guest â " Commissioner Bud Selig, playerâ ™s union director Don Fehr and New York Yankee owner George Steinbrenner â " and how their battles ultimately shaped the game are reported in this well-researched book by Jon Pessah. Drawn upon hundreds of hours of interviews from numerous sources, people and teams, the reporting on the issues of the last twenty years is written in a narrative that is both entertaining and compelling. The back cover states that the book was five years in the making, and given the extensive coverage of the gameâ ™s finances and later its response to allegations of the use of PEDs, that doesnâ ™t sound like a stretch at all. How these three men affected these issues will grab the readerâ ™s interest and wonâ ™t let go. â œPowerâ • is an appropriate word to use for the goals of these three men, as all three are portrayed as men who believe they know what is best for the game and his constituents. Whether itâ ™s Selig wanting to force the owners into a revenue sharing agreement, Fehr insisting on getting the truth about labor negotiations or Steinbrenner spending more on one player he thinks the

Yankees need for another championship than what some teams spend on the entire payroll, this book covers all the major issues.
