

His focused hard-work played a crucial role in him reaching where he did. Secondly, I wanted to find out what kept him so grounded? How can anyone who has achieved what he has, stay so humble? Sachin is almost revered like a â œGodâ • in India & yet he managed to stay humble. How did he do that? The answer to this guestion is his family & in particular his father.
