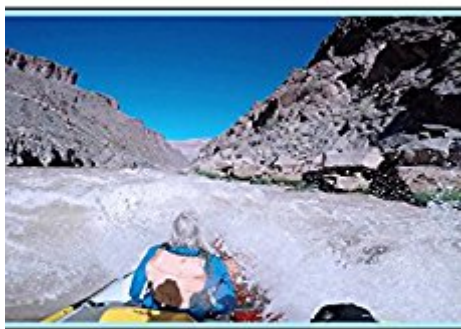

This a sweet story about a group of semi-skilled boaters and adventurers taking their first trip on the Colorado River through Grand Canyon as seen through the eyes of the author. It's not fine literature, there are misspellings, and some of the river running details are incorrect (or overblown), but those minor missteps by the author do not detract in any material way from the adventure.

Rafting through the canyon is an amazing experience, and the first time can provide memories of a lifetime. I think the author captured the excitement, thrills, apprehension, tensions, and the overall experience quite nicely. She clearly had a blast, as did her fellow boaters. Kudos to her for taking on the challenges of a do-it-your-own trip.
